Diane Martineau, Abstract Painting Collages

Perhaps inspired by the rural countryside all around us, I try to capture the astounding colors and textures of nature I see in peaceful fields, lively streams, sheltering hills--and skies in all kinds of moods.

Painting with acrylics, I have only vague ideas of how I might use the hundreds of colorful fragments that end up on my paper. Eventually I start playing with the pieces, shuffling them around, tearing and cutting them into shapes, overlapping them. I'm looking for connections, elements that relate. I continue to move pieces here and there, until a scene starts to form, and a picture comes together. I'll probably clip and reclip various pieces together several times.

Often, I'm surprised by what has evolved--maybe wild ocean waves, stormy skies, fanciful images or an unabashedly nostalgic pastoral scene. I may add trees, a bird, a sun or a moon. When the scene comes alive for me and feels right, I glue everything to a backing and the work is finished.

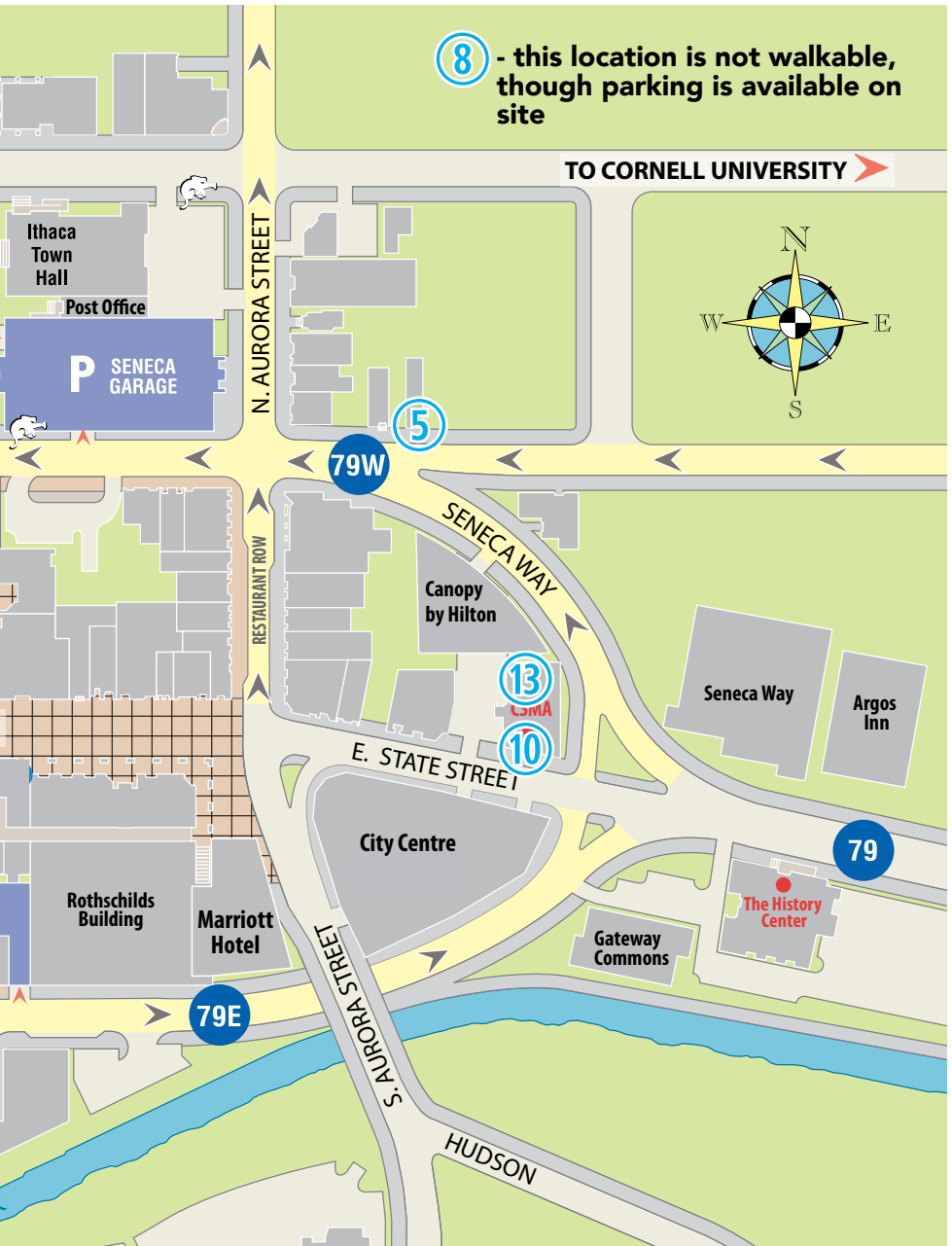

Kaplan states: I was inspired by a Matisse and Diebenkorn exhibition I saw several years ago where the curator paired work by each artist. I have always been inspired by David's use of light and color and thought it would be an exciting challenge to create some paintings that were inspired by his photographs.

Watkins responds: I've always admired Ileen's ability to create a light and color-filled canvas in the most interesting abstract way. This opportunity to exhibit with her led me to focus some of my own work on natural patterns of light and color in the landscape. Ultimately, the pairings in the show reflect how each of us "sees."

Individually submerging into their experiences of Black and Indigenous peoples' vitality in bountiful to barren social scapes, they recognize the refuge in turning to landscapes, creating an opening for merging an ever changing stream of connections between them.

al aguas seeks communion of intentional physicalities and incorporeal intimacies through a fractal working of textiles, sculpture, dance, and written word. They envision a space where their intersectional identity is calibrated and stimulated at the artists' discretion, as they are a trans, disabled Zapotec writer and youth educator.

Sonja Lockhart is a public health professional and artist who is passionate about advancing health equity. She is currently pursuing her Masters in Public Health at Cornell University where she is focusing on food systems and thinking about how to transform local food environments to support community health and wellbeing.
