- -Megan advised that the grants receivables are updated now and off the A/R list

- -Staffing was off by a little bit, about \$3,000.00; this is due to overtime being paid out to Jane as well as Scott's PTO payout

Statement of Downtown Report:

- -Darlene Wilber presented the state of downtown report
- -Some key takeaways: The report tracks several things (i.e. population, development projects, workforce, quality of life, and tourism).

Retail Incubator Project:

- -Kristina Thelen walked everyone through the potential Retail Incubator project
- -The goal of this project is to address economic disparity and to increase representation of businesses owned by minority people of color
- -The goals are to create opportunities for economic advancement and providing support in business management
- -The incubator will engage businesses at all levels from startup to more established businesses. It will be a retail space with a range of sublease options with a central checkout and shared staff.
- -Kristina advised the DIA is applying for the USDA grant that would provide the necessary funds to start this project.

- -Gary presented a resolution that needs to be approved by the board to include with the DIA's USDA grant application
- -Nathan Lyman motioned to approve the resolution as written, John Guttridge seconded the motion.
